The 1st phase lasts 3 months during which time the men are under 24/7 supervision, and attend classes morning and evening. The 2nd phase is 6 months long, which includes finding work, while attending evening classes and counseling. Open Homes has been helping men overcome their addictions for over 30 years. We work regularly with the Probation Departments in the tri-county area, as well as other states in the continental US. We also work with the State of Florida Corrections Department and will provide progress reports on request from supervising officers.
